OVERCONSUME

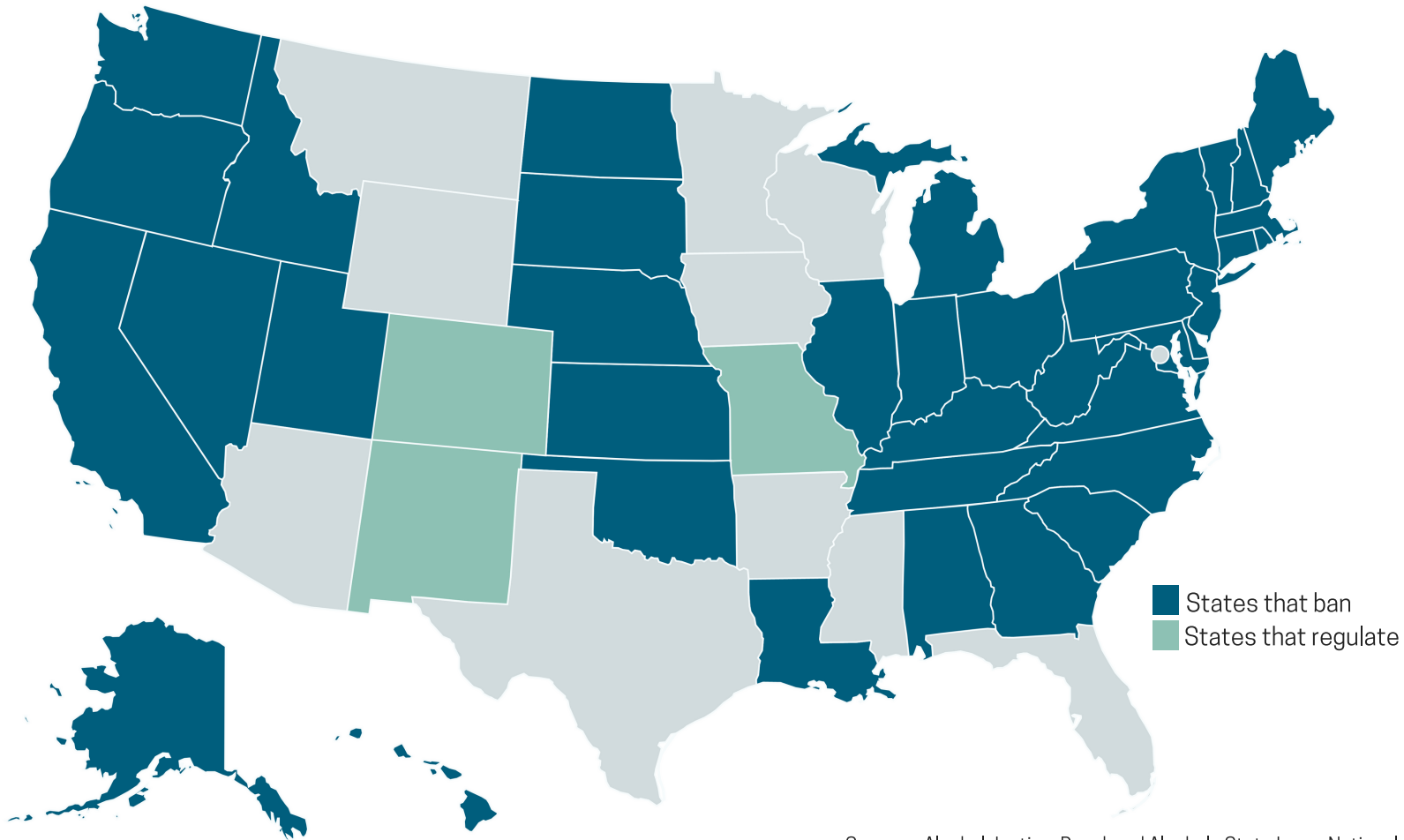
Combining one or more packets of powdered alcohol with an alcoholic beverage would increase the alcohol content in a standard mixed drink.
